2012 Engineer of the Year Award

The Engineer of the Year Award presented by the Richmond Joint Engineers' Council seeks to recognize an individual, business or organization that has made a significant contribution to the engineering profession in the greater Richmond metropolitan area or surrounding counties through the application of engineering principles, the development of new technology, or the refinement of an existing technology.

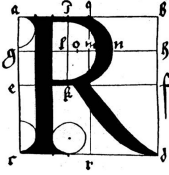
GUIDELINES

1. **Eligibility:** The RJEC Engineer of the Year Award is made to anyone residing, working or otherwise affecting the greater Richmond, Virginia and surrounding counties for achievement in any engineering discipline.
2. **Nomination:** Nominations for the RJEC Engineer of the Year Award may be made by an individual; an engineering, professional or technical society; a business; or an educational institution. A nomination must include a completed copy of the attached nomination form. Additionally, letters of support from colleagues, peers or others who can further explain the importance of the contribution and any other documentation supporting the nomination is encouraged to be submitted along with the form.

Completed nomination packages must be received by the RJEC by January 20, 2012.

Nominations may be mailed to the attention of Mike Howell at RJEC, PO Box 8988, Richmond VA 23225. Alternatively, completed forms may be submitted electronically to mike.howell@rjec.org with Engineer of the Year Award in the subject line.

3. **Selection Factors:** Aspects such as technical accomplishments, innovation, leadership, and recognition within his / her discipline or professional / technical organization will all be taken into consideration.
4. **Limitations:** An individual may only receive this award once in his or her lifetime and may not win the Community Service Award in the same year.
5. **Re-nomination:** Candidates nominated who are not selected as Engineer of the Year may be re-nominated. The nomination packets will be held for resubmission, but a new nomination form must be completed, along with any new supporting documentation.

The Community Service Award presented by the Richmond Joint Engineers' Council seeks to recognize an individual, business or organization who serves as an example of the dedication and integrity of the engineering profession through their service, volunteerism, or dedication to the greater Richmond metropolitan area or surrounding counties.

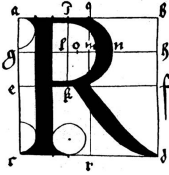
GUIDELINES

2. **Nomination:** Nominations for the RJEC Community Service Award may be made by an individual; an engineering, professional or technical society; a business; or an educational institution. A nomination must include a completed copy of the attached nomination form. 5. **Re-nomination:** Candidates nominated who are not selected for the Community Service Award may be re-nominated. The nomination packets will be held for resubmission, but a new nomination form must be completed, along with any new supporting documentation.
